KIKKO PRINTMAKING




KIKKO are small hexagonal shaped plates meant to represent the shell of a turtle. In samurai armor, these plates would be attached to heavy fabric, or connected with chainmail to create a flexible and protective barrier. Create KIKKO-inspired art with this activity!


You will need:

- A piece of bubble wrap (bigger bubbles are best!)
- A sheet of paper, try construction paper to create a colorful design!
- Acrylic or Tempera paint
- Paintbrush
- Crayons, Markers or Colored pencils



- I) Paint your bubblewrap. You can paint the whole piece or a small part. Experiment with different paint colors and designs.
- 2) Carefully lay your painted bubble wrap on your sheet of paper. Press down lightly to make sure the paint transfers to your paper.





- 3) Slowly pull off your bubble wrap and reveal your printed design!
- 4) Using a crayon, marker or colored pencil decorate your bubble wrap print! Turn your circles into hexagons for the KIKKO look!
